Site Plans – A Simple Explanation

There seems to be some confusion about what a site plan is and how to do one when applying for a permit with the Inspection Department. Please call 269-983-1212 with specific questions.

Please take a moment to review the following information:

What is a Site Plan? A site plan is a drawing of a lot (or parcel) that shows a building footprint, driveways, or parking areas, accessory buildings (sheds, garages, etc.), decks, stairs, or anything above 6" off existing grade. It basically shows the plan view of a lot. A site plan is a key element for providing adequate information when applying for a permit.

Why would I need a site plan? A site plan is necessary for building permits, fence & shed permits, or any project that involves lot coverage. It helps to show lot coverage and setback dimensions.

How do I get a site plan? You can draw a site plan yourself or hire a surveying company. Sometimes the mortgage company will require a survey, so it may be in your documents from a lending institution:

- 1. Determine property boundaries and your lot dimensions (in this example the lot is 50 ' by 100').
- 2. Show roads and sidewalks, and show a "North" arrow.
- 3. Determine the location of structures for anything that is 6 (six) inches above grade, and remember to measure from the drip edge (eave to eave), NOT the wall.
- 4. Determine your zoning district and the respective requirements. (go to www.sjcity.com)
