

# Lake Boulevard and Broad Street Resurfacing Project

## Initial Project Update

**Public Meeting Notice: March 19, 2024 at 6:00 pm – City Hall Commission Chambers**

The Lake Boulevard and Broad Street Resurfacing Project will soon be underway; therefore, this update is being published to inform those impacted or interested in the project of what to expect. The construction will include Lake Boulevard from Hatch Street to Ship Street and Broad Street from Lake Boulevard to State Street. The reason the project is being undertaken is to resurface the pavement and to replace sidewalk ramps as needed to meet the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements. The resurfacing work consists of a one-course (2" in depth) mill and overlay of hot mix asphalt (HMA) pavement.

City Staff and Abonmarche Consultants have teamed to manage projects successfully in the City for over 20 years. The contractor, Rieth Riley is located in Benton Harbor, Michigan and has worked in the City on numerous projects, most recently as the general contractor on the 2023 Resurfacing Project.

### **Schedule Information**

The Contract Progress Clause allowed work to start as early as April 1, and completion to be on or before June 7. Rieth Riley has informed the City that they currently intend to start the project on April 1 and complete the work prior to Memorial Day.

### **Scope of Work**

As stated above, the proposed work will occur on Lake Boulevard from Hatch Street to Ship Street and on Broad Street from Lake Boulevard to State Street. While the roadway resurfacing is underway, we will take the opportunity to replace sidewalk ramps in order to meet current ADA standards.

### **Traffic Maintenance / Access / Trash Pickup / Water Service**

Access to driveways, on-street parking and traffic maintenance will be a challenge during this project and we ask your patience, particularly when construction impacts your property frontage. Fortunately, the bulk of this work will consist of milling and resurfacing the asphalt pavement, which is a relatively quick process – as compared to full roadway reconstruction - so driveway closures and roadway detours/closures will be on the order of weeks and not months.

For trash and recycle pickup, we request that you place your containers along the road as normal. If you have a problem with your trash pickup, please contact Liam Cormier, Streets Superintendent (telephone: 269-983-6341, email: [lcormier@sjcity.com](mailto:lcormier@sjcity.com)). We expect the U.S. Postal Service to be able to maintain normal mail delivery however, should this prove to be problematic we will contact you with further information.

We do not anticipate any water service shut off as part of this project. If unexpected conditions are encountered such as water main breaks or service leaks, the water may need

to be shut off without notice. If such a situation occurs, the on-site inspector(s) will do his/her best to keep the affected businesses and residents updated on the situation. After a water interruption, it is likely sediment from the old main will be suspended in the water. We ask that you flush your service line by running water from an outside spigot or a utility sink to clear your water service. It is important to note that your water service may be affected even if work is not occurring directly in front of your property.

### **Contact Information**

General construction related questions should be directed to Tim Drews at Abonmarche or Tim Zebell, City Engineer. Specific minor construction issues should be directed to the Abonmarche Inspector on site. The inspectors are generally easily identifiable as they wear Abonmarche shirts and typically drive vehicles with the company logo. A contact information sheet is attached and may be clipped for posting on your refrigerator, etc. We also request that you fill out and return the attached contact information form. This will allow City Staff to contact you should a construction related issue require individual notification during the day.

A Public Meeting will be held at 6:00 pm on March 19, 2024 in the City Commission Chambers at City Hall for those with questions or desiring additional information. In addition to this notice and the Public Meeting, progress notices will be posted to the City's website ([www.sjcity.com](http://www.sjcity.com)) and Public Works Facebook page on a periodic basis. If you are interested in receiving update notices via email, please provide your email address on the attached form. We thank you for your patience during this time of inconvenience. The project will ultimately result in better roadway, drainage, and sidewalk ramps in the project area.

## Commonly Asked Questions Regarding Construction Projects

- 1) **What is typically done on a street resurfacing project?**

The project will include milling a 2" depth of the existing asphalt pavement and repaving the roadway with new asphalt.
- 2) **How long will I be without water?**

No planned water shut offs are expected, however, water main breaks can occur during construction. If this occurs, the on-site inspector will do their best to keep impacted properties informed of the duration of the interruption.
- 3) **When will work start and how long will it take to complete the project?**

The project could start as early as April 1 and is expected to be complete prior to Memorial Day. The replacement of ADA ramps and sidewalk will lead off, followed by the milling and resurfacing of the roadway.
- 4) **Who is the Contractor?**

Rieth Riley submitted the low bid of \$714,910.85 through the MDOT bid letting process. Approximately \$585,000 of the project cost will be covered by the Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funding, and that requires the project to adhere to Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) requirements.
- 5) **Will trees be removed in front of my house?**

Public Works has completed the one tree removal needed for ADA ramp improvements at the northeast corner of Lake Blvd and Hoyt Street.
- 6) **I require special care/services; how will the project affect me?**

If you have a condition that requires special consideration i.e. medical services, disabled accessibility, Meals on Wheels, etc. please contact the City Engineer, Tim Zebell, as soon as possible (983-5541). We will notify the Contractor of your needs and schedule a meeting to discuss your particular circumstances, if necessary.
- 7) **If I have a problem during construction, who do I contact?**

Abonmarche Consultants will have an Inspector on the project; he or she should be your first contact (the Inspectors typically wear shirts that identify them as an Abonmarche employee). If the Inspector cannot be contacted, please call Tim Drews at 269-876-9286.
- 8) **What about access to my driveway?**

Driveways will be inaccessible for varying length of times dependent upon the work items underway, however, milling and resurfacing operations allow for driveway access in a much shorter turnaround time than full roadway reconstruction.
- 9) **Why does the project need to be done?**

The project is being undertaken to resurface the street and reconstruct select sidewalk ramps to meet current standards.
- 10) **If I have a problem after normal hours, who do I contact?**

In case of an emergency, please dial 911. If your problem is less critical in nature, for example no water service, sewer backup, etc. please contact the St. Joseph Drinking Water Treatment Plant (269-983-1240). The operator on duty will then contact the appropriate personnel to address your concern.
