WAYS TO GET HERE

What sets St. Joseph apart from many lake resort communities is how easy it is to get here. You are within minutes of toll-free I-94, I-196, US-12, US-31, M-139 and M-63. The Amtrak train stops in St. Joseph twice daily between Grand Rapids and Chicago. Recreational boaters dock at many sheltered marinas on the St. Joseph River and a Coast Guard Station protects boaters on Lake Michigan.

Air travel is as close as the Benton Harbor Regional Airport or domestic and international flights from South Bend, Kalamazoo, Grand Rapids, Chicago and Detroit.
